JOURNEY TO THE SPIRIT MOUNTAINS

12 days/11 nights

Departs 02 Jul 2010 ex St John's, Newfoundland

Discover the spectacular, rugged beauty of one of Canada's least-visited regions, the coast of northern Labrador. Visit important historical and archaeological sites, and take the time for a leisurely exploration of the uncharted fiords and narrow channels formed where the Torngat Mountain Range falls into the deep North Atlantic waters. As you cruise deeper into the southward-drifting masses of breathtaking sea ice and icebergs, keep an eye out for diverse wildlife including polar bears, seals, several species of whales and huge colonies of birds.

ITINERARY

Day 1: Embark in St John's following a buffet lunch. Watch for humpback whales, puffins, storm petrels and gannets. LD **Days 2-11:** Explore the highlights of Newfoundland and Labrador's coastlines. Among the locations visited are: the UNESCO world heritage site L'Anse aux Meadows; Red Bay; picturesque Battle Harbour; the wildlife rich and remote islands around Man of War Point; cultural Makkovik; Nain; Hebron; beautiful Torngat Mountains National Park Reserve and Killiniq, location of diverse marine mammals including polar bears, seals and whales. BLD **Day 12:** Disembark Kuujuaq. After a brief tour of the town and buffet lunch, transfer to the airport for onward flight. Tour ends. BL
