Tofino is a picturesque fishing village at the entrance to the Clayoquot Sound on Vancouver Island. Known for its beautiful scenery, Grey Whales and storm watching, the area is popular for walking, wilderness hikes, kayaking and deep sea fishing. It has some of the best beaches on Vancouver Island.

Day 1 Tofino

Depart Vancouver in your rental car and catch the Horeshoe Bay Ferry across Georgia Strait to Nanaimo on Vancouver Island. Drive to Tofino and check into the Best Western Tin Wis Resort for the next 3 nights. This beachfront hotel offers stunning ocean views from all 85 rooms.

Days 2/3 Tofino

Today explore the Clayoquot Sounds on your choice of 2 tours (1 included). Travel to the traditional feeding grounds of the Grey Whales where you may also see Orcas and sea lions or cruise along sheltered coves watching Black Bears forage for crabs and other treats. On day 3 enjoy a boat trip to experience the Hot Springs at Sharps Point (included).

Day 4 Tour ends

Drive back to Nanaimo at your own pace to catch the ferry back to the mainland. Return rental car. Tour ends.

Price per person includes: Coach transfer from Victoria to Port McNeill, accommodation with meals as per itinerary, half day whale watching in Johnstone Strait, full day Grizzly Bear viewing at Knight's Inlet, entrance to U'Mista Cultural Centre, transfer from Port McNeill to Port Hardy, air transfer from Port Hardy to Vancouver, HST.

Not included: Ferry to/from Alert Bay (approx CAD\$9 one-way), arrival taxi's in Alert Bay (approx CAD\$5 one-way), optional activities and gratuities.

Explore the pristine waters of Johnstone Strait, home to the largest population of Orcas in the world. Go Grizzly Bear viewing in Knight Inlet, renowned for its bears, marine wildlife and scenery.

Day 1 Alert Bay

Depart Victoria for Alert Bay and check into Four Room Ocean View Inn. D

Day 2 Alert Bay

Cruise by zodiac on Johnstone Strait, searching for Orcas, Minke Whales, Pacific White Sided Dolphins, and other marine wildlife. Look out for Black Bear, deer and cougar on the shore. BL

Day 3 Alert Bay

The day is free to explore Alert Bay. Highlights include Cormorant Island, U'Mista Cultural Centre, the Ecological Gardens and Big Tree Trail. BL

Day 4 Alert Bay

Full day tour by boat to Knight Inlet, famous for its Grizzly Bears, beautiful scenery and marine life. Paddle or motor quietly around the estuary, where Grizzly Bears feed on the sedges and grasses. BL

Day 5 Tour ends Vancouver

After breakfast transfer to Port Hardy Airport for afternoon scheduled flight to Vancouver. Tour ends. B

Price per person includes: Air transfer by float plane from Vancouver to resort, twin share accommodation on full board basis, all drinks (including house wine and beer), guided and unguided activities including hiking, horseback riding, kayaking/canoeing, wildlife viewing, Hot Springs Cove trek, Wild Side First Nations Interpretive tour, limited fishing, a massage treatment, HST, gratuities and conservation fee.

Conservation Fee: This fee goes directly to the resort's environmental stewardship programs and to reducing its carbon footprint.

Accessible only by boat or floatplane, Clayoquot Wilderness Outpost is a secluded enclave of 20 safari-style tents equipped with private showers and power for essentials. There is also a ranch-style cookhouse providing world class cuisine, lounge, spa, wood fired hot tubs and woodstoves. Guests can enjoy both guided and unguided activities including paddling, biking and hiking through pure wilderness. This region is home to prolific wildlife including bears, puffins and porpoises. You are also invited to take part in environmental programs funded by the resort such as bear mapping and raptor rehabilitation.

Day 1 Wilderness Outpost
Enjoy a floatplane flight (approx. 1 hr) enroute to the resort. Spend the afternoon fishing or trekking before savouring dinner in the charming cookhouse.

Days 2/3 Wilderness Outpost
Glide across whale rich waters to bathe in the geothermal pools of Hot Springs Cove. Later, embark on a guided hike through ancient forests.

Day 4 Tour ends Vancouver
After breakfast return to Vancouver. Tour ends.

Day 1 King Pacific Lodge
You will be met in Vancouver and transferred by charter flight and sea plane to King Pacific Lodge on Princess Royal Island. The lodge floats on the edge of a sheltered cove and can only be reached by boat or plane. Choose from a range of outdoor guided activities and enjoy gourmet meals, picnics, and facilities such as sauna, steam room, whirlpool and plunge pool.

Days 2/3 King Pacific Lodge
Enjoy guided wilderness activities depending on the season. Travel by boat or on foot to the best wildlife viewing spots.

Day 4 Tour ends Vancouver
Fly back to Vancouver where your tour ends.
